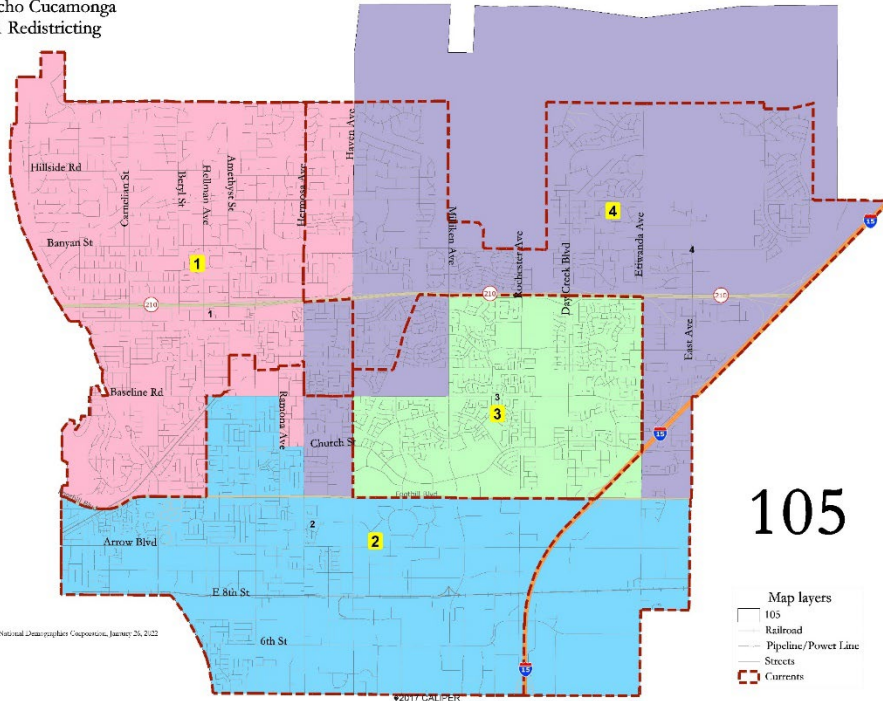
Key Notes

Each of the 4 districts must contain about 43,702 individuals.



Features of Preferred Map Selection

Major components and highlights of the preferred map include:

- Population Balance
- Compact geographical shapes
- Keeps together key communities of interest
- Pushes District 2 boundary north of Foothill to Base Line between Hellman and Hermosa for optimum density, creating an area of highest Latino Citizen Voting Age Population (CVAP) at 44%
- District 4 boundary is revised for better population balance between Districts



Recommendation:

- Conduct the public hearing;
- Introduce first reading of Ordinance No. 997, to be read by title only and waive further reading, adjusting the boundaries of the four City Council Districts and adopting a new official Council District Map based on the results of the 2020 decennial census
